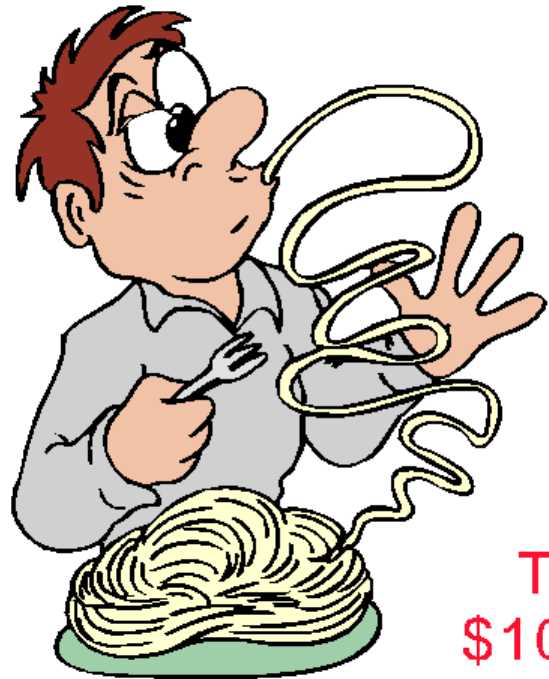

All proceeds from this auction will go directly to the KWNA Ladies Auxiliary.

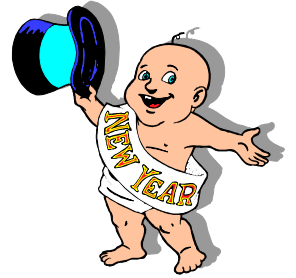
